- proposed budget (> €70 billion over 7 years)






Budgets of the EU Framework Programmes

- Third countries
 - Industrialised countries

International Cooperation (4)

- Specific cooperation actions
 - between the EU and third countries
- Cooperation on particular topics
 - in the case of mutual interest
- Closely associated with cooperation agreements and multilateral dialogues
- Important tools for implementing cooperation between EU and these countries
